DAVENPORT CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION

Minutes of Regular Meeting June 11, 2020

The Davenport Civil Rights Commission (DCRC) met at noon, Tuesday, June 11, 2020, through a zoom meeting. Commissioner Swanberg presided.

COMMISSIONERS PRESENT: Boyd, Gaston, Guster, Karp, Mateos, Pokora, Swanberg,

COMMISSIONERS ABSENT: None

OTHER PERSONS PRESENT:

Latrice Lacey

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On motion by Commissioner Mateos, seconded by Commissioner Boyd, minutes of the regular meeting of December 10, 2019, were approved. All Commissioners voted aye. (For all votes, raise of hand means "aye", thumbs down means "nay")

July 2019 meeting minutes to be added to the July 2020 meeting.

On motion by Commissioner Boyd, seconded by Commissioner Mateos, minutes of the regular meeting of March 10, 2020, were approved. All Commissioners voted aye.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

On motion of Commissioner Boyd, seconded by Commissioner Karp, the Report of the Director was received. All Commissioners voted aye.

- a. March 2020 Director Lacey presented on the survey for the LGBTQ community. Commissioner Mateos asked about how the LGBTQ residents of Davenport were reached. Director Lacey shared that the survey was posted on Facebook.
- b. April 2020 Commissioners Mateos, Boyd, Guster, and Pokora are interested in participating at the D-CAP meetings with the Davenport Police Department. Director Lacey will check how many voting seats the Commission will get. Others who are interested can still attend the meeting but will not be able to vote.
- c. May 2020 Civil Rights office to reopen on June 15, 2020. Masks are required and available to the public. Staggered office time to maintain social distancing. Plexi glass has been installed.
- d. Commission discussed about taking action to look at discrimination cases around Davenport. Possible recommendations to the City Council. Consider special meeting regarding civil unrests, systemic racism, and perceptions around the community and hear directly from residents.

Commissioner Boyd asked whether we have any resources to help us, as Commissioners, to try to stay aware of what is going on in the community in the wake of George Floyd's death. Director Lacey mentioned she works with community groups when she is contacted. Commissioner Boyd stated that she would like to be able to take the temperature of the community so the Commission can be proactive regarding these issues. Commissioner Karp stated the Commission ought to be taking a more active role in helping facilitate the flow of concern from the protests toward systemic change. In response to a question about whether the Commission can do that, Latrice responded that one of our duties under the city ordinance is to look into discrimination, and we can make recommendations to the City Council.

Commissioner Lee Gaston indicated he thought this might be an excellent opportunity to focus on our community and what we're doing. Commissioner Karp feels this is an opportunity for us as a Commission to talk with the City and the Police Departments. Before we do that, we need to find out what perceptions are in the community and what are the needs of minorities so we can help channel their concerns to the City and the police. Director Lacey mentioned that she had been working with a couple of community members who would like her to conduct a listening session to hear individual stories from them. She has already agreed to meet with them and would be willing to compile those comments and provide them to the Commission, in a manner similar to how she conducted such sessions with members of the deaf community a couple of years ago and provided those comments to the Commission. In that initiative, Len Sandler of the Iowa law school provided training to the local police department regarding deafness service issues. Director Lacey indicated she would be meeting with community members during the next week; the meetings will be private due to the fear of retaliation on the part of some participants. Chairperson Swanberg asked whether we will need to have a special meeting of the Commission since, during our regular monthly meetings, there is not sufficient time to discuss these issues. There was a general consensus that we need to hear from Davenport citizens, and Director Lacey was asked to compile the comments and report to the Commission. She will provide her report to the Chair and Vice Chair. That report will then be provided to all Commissioners prior to the July meeting.

The special meeting, an open meeting with time for public comment, will be an opportunity for the Commission to get more input from citizens, and to discuss in a working session how we feel it may be best to try to address the issues. Commissioner Guster believes Chief of Police Sokorski should meet with any Commissions that ask him to, and emphasizes that now is the time to try to work through some of these issues, and we need to work on issues like use of chokeholds, racial profiling, and the racism issue generally. Commissioner Boyd agrees and feels this will be a good, positive way to encourage input and to provide a forum where we can be made aware of how things are going and how they should be in our community. Chair Swanberg confirms she is hearing we are favoring having a special meeting to hear anyone who wants to address us and then discuss with strategies. Is everyone in agreement with this plan? There was a consensus for having a special meeting. The date and time of the meeting will be set at our regular July meeting.

Minutes of Regular Meeting July 14, 2020

The Davenport Civil Rights Commission (DCRC) met at noon, Tuesday, July 14, 2020, through a zoom meeting. Commissioner Swanberg presided.

COMMISSIONERS PRESENT: Boyd, Gaston, Guster, Karp, Mateos, Pokora, Swanberg,

COMMISSIONERS ABSENT: None

OTHER PERSONS PRESENT:

Latrice Lacey

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

On motion by Commissioner Boyd, seconded by Commissioner Gaston, the agenda for the regular meeting of July 14, 2020 were approved. All Commissioners voted aye (For all votes, raise of hand means "aye", thumbs down means "nay").

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On motion by Commissioner Gaston, seconded by Commissioner Mateos, minutes of the regular meeting of July 2019, with the adjustment of Commissioner Gaston's name written twice, were approved. Commissioner Boyd abstains. All other Commissioners voted aye.

On motion of Commissioner Boyd, seconded by Commissioner Gaston, minutes of the regular meeting of June 11, 2020 were tabled for the next meeting. Minutes need to show reviewed cases that were not approved. A note/disclaimer shall be added, "Cases voted to have no public hearing are decided based on the resources available to the Commission and not based on the merits of the specific case." All Commissioners voted aye.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

- a. June 2020 Director Lacey presented on the discussed strategies used by the police department in arrests and profiling. Issues of ignoring violence against minorities, overpolicing, and under-policing have also been presented and discussed. Director Lacey will share the report with Commission members through email.
 Commissioner Guster asked about receiving updates and making sure there are deliverables from the police chief to bring about change. Commissioner Swanberg mentioned that this is just the beginning of the conversation about community policing. The Commission shall discuss and come up with recommendations.
- b. Director Lacy shared a report of policing reforms that have been planned or implemented throughout the State of Iowa.

NEW BUSINESS

- a. PA-0133-0025-15 Director Lacey mentioned this is a meritorious case and recommends taking it to public hearing. Commissioner Gaston asked about getting a list of criteria for a case to be taken to public hearing. On motion by Commissioner Guster, seconded by Commissioner Mateos, this case is approved to go to public hearing.
- b. Director's Wage Increase Commissioners discussed the Director's wage increase. Director Lacey mentioned that there is a \$10,000 earmarked in the budget. Commissioner Gaston suggested to hold off on the vote until we get necessary information from HR department. Commissioner Swanberg to ask for information on other director's salary increases. Commissioner Mateos requested to include and ask for Director Lacey's past performance reviews. Commissioner Guster suggested to vote now on the 1% increase that was supposed to be given in 2019, and the 1% increase for 2020. Performance increase will be discussed at the next meeting. On motion by Commissioner Karp, seconded by Commissioner Guster, Commissioner Mateos abstains, Commissioner Gaston opposed, motion carries.
- c. Meeting Format City's communication department have been recording meetings and posting them on the City website in the past. On motion by Commissioner Karp, seconded by Commissioner Guster, topic is tabled for the next meeting.
- d. Special Commission Meeting This meeting will be to invite community members and discuss the culture of policing in the area. A press release will be sent out to make the public aware. The meeting is scheduled to be on August 1st, at 10am, via zoom.
- e. Request for Increased Funding for Commission A business plan will be submitted to the City Council at the end of July 2020 to request for increase of funding for the Commission. This is in line with what is currently going on across the nation. The City of Davenport hears more cases than other civil rights commissions in the area. Commissioner Mateos asked for a comparison between the City of Davenport and the surrounding cities' number of cases, budget, and expenses. The Commission Chair will look into getting on the agenda of an upcoming City Council meeting.
- f. Commission Letter Commissioner Swanberg and Director Lacey drafted a letter addressed to the Mayor stating the request of the Commission to be informed in the future when the City Council considers a change to the Davenport Civil Rights Ordinance. Commissioner Mateos will convert the letter to a pdf format and email the letter to all Commissioners for electronic signatures. On motion by Commissioner Gaston, seconded by Commissioner Mateos, motion approved. All Commissioners voted aye.
- g. ICRC Contract Director Lacey will share the contract to all Commissioners for review, to be signed by Commissioner Swanberg. On motion by Commissioner Guster, seconded by Commissioner Karp, the contract is approved. All Commissioners voted aye.
- h. HUD PAR Tabled for the next meeting


