APPROVAL OF AGENDA

On motion of Commissioner Mateos, seconded by Commissioner Boyd, the agenda for the special meeting of September 10, 2020 was approved. All Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

DISCUSSION

Director Lacey provided a summary of the Seeberger case. Commissioner Mateos contacted the City Clerk's office to ask for the video and notes for the case, was told that the City Clerk office does not have any of the Commission's cases. Director Lacey said she is aware that the recording and notes were sent to the City Clerk office. Commissioner Karp said that the Commission needs to show documentation that the City Clerk's office received those items.

DAVENPORT CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION Minutes of Regular Meeting August 21st, 2020

The Davenport Civil Rights Commission (DCRC) met at 12 p.m., Friday, August 21st, 2020, through a zoom meeting. Commissioner Swanberg presided.

COMMISSIONERS PRESENT: Boyd, Gaston, Guster, Karp, Mateos, Pokora, Swanberg,

COMMISSIONERS ABSENT: None

OTHER PERSONS PRESENT: Latrice Lacey, members of the community

Moment of silence for Clyde Mayfield

APPROVAL OF AGENDA

On motion by Commissioner Boyd, seconded by Commissioner Mateos, the agenda for the regular meeting was approved. All Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On motion by Commissioner Karp, seconded by Commissioner Guster, the revised minutes for the regular meeting of June 2020 were approved. All Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

On motion by Commissioner Boyd, seconded by Commissioner Guster, with the deletion of the statement on E. Request for Increased Funding for Commission except for the last sentence, the minutes for the regular meeting in July 2020 were approved. All Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Director's report was presented. There was a discussion about the public meeting and how the Commissioners are to handle it.

On DCAP meetings, Director Lacey and Commissioners Guster and Boyd discussed the review of data regarding all interactions with community members and the importance of using body cameras to see how people are being interacted with. The police department was not able to join. Community members want to restart discussions about restorative justice; others wish to formulate a plan.

FOIA request from a Program Supervisor from Washington, DC for the Commission's contract with EEOC. Director Lacey stated that the document was never requested. Commissioner Swanberg spoke with Assistant City Attorney in question and was informed that information provided to the agency involved would be rectified. There was

a discussion amongst the Commissioners about working with the City of Davenport agencies on moving forward.

Harassment – The statement issued by the City of Davenport police union leader has been perceived as harassing. There have also been comments about armed resistance against the office of the Commission. Some Commissioners have no awareness of the said social media posts that have now been deleted. Perhaps, there will be an attempt to retrieve those messages and take it to the Iowa Department of Public Safety for investigation. There need to be appropriate actions taken to discipline those involved. There was a discussion of a weekend rally to happen, which Mayor Matson is aware of and has personnel in place in the event they are needed. Director Lacey will provide information to the Commissioners and cc Mayor Matson.

OLD BUSINESS

- a. H-0123-0026-14 There was a discussion about looking at the video of the hearing, the decision of the district court, court of appeals, and the supreme court. The issue to be decided is the basis for the reduction in damages and whether there was a clarification of what the ruling was based on.
- b. Commission letter Commissioner Pokora will refuse to sign the Commission letter to the Mayor and the City Council. There was a discussion that the Council had already approved the Civil Rights Ordinance amendment. The Commission would like to be asked to be included in future talks. Commissioner Mateos to update the date of the letter and resend it to all for electronic signatures.
- c. Email format Some on the Commission would like to use City provided email which the Information Technology director for the City states is secure and that other email providers such as hotmail and gmail are not. A policy might need to be looked at. Commissioner Mateos will contact the City IT for information.
- d. Commissioner Training There was a discussion of having 4 days of half-day training for the Commissioners. The Commission came up with the following schedule: from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. on September 23rd, October 14th, October 21st, and November 18th. Director Lacey will send calendar invites/notice when training dates are confirmed.
- e. Meeting format There was a discussion of recording and posting the videos on the Commission website. Commissioners are sensitive to the need for transparency. On motion of Commissioner Gaston, seconded by Commissioner Mateos, the Commission will continue recording the zoom meetings and hold off on the posting of those recordings on the website. All Commissioners voted on the affirmative.
- f. Requests for Increased Funding Commissioner Swanberg has spoken with the Mayor. The Commission will ask for this discussion to be a working session with the City Council. Commissioner Mateos asked for a comparison report of where we stand compared to other similarly sized civil rights commission office. Director Lacey to present at the next meeting.
- g. Special Commission Meeting There is a scheduled meeting on policing reform on August 24th via Zoom. There was a discussion of increasing the number of stakeholders and major groups to be invited. On motion of Commissioner Karp,

seconded by Commissioner Guster, NAACP, Black Lives Matter, QC Pride, LULAC, Boots on the Ground will be invited to the next meeting. All Commissioners voted in the affirmative.

h. HUD PAR – tabled for the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

- a. Topics for the discussion at the police reform meeting Give the Mayor and the police chief opportunity to discuss the actions that have been taken to address these policing issues in the community. Gather information through research, review documents shared by Director Lacey, and information from the special meeting to determine steps moving forward.
- b. Commissioner Swanberg noted that these items be included in the agenda for the next meeting: By laws, Personnel Committee, and special meeting date.

PUBLIC COMMENT

a. LR – Feels targeted by white supremacists. Commission should not turn a blind eye from threats, social media posts.

At 2:51 p.m., a motion was made by Commissioner Boyd, seconded by Commissioner Guster to adjourn the meeting. All Commissioners voted in the affirmative.
