## DAVENPORT CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION Minutes of Regular Meeting July 13, 2021

The Davenport Civil Rights Commission (DCRC) met at 12:00 p.m. Tuesday, July 13, 2021, online using Zoom. Commission Vice Chair Henry Karp, presided.

#### **COMMISSIONERS PRESENT:**

#### OTHER PERSONS PRESENT:

#### **AGENDA**

A motion was made by Commissioner Boyd to approve the agenda, it was seconded by Commissioner Swanberg. All commissioners voted yes.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

On motion by Commissioner Boyd, seconded by Commissioner Guster, minutes of the regular meeting of June 8, 2021 were approved with an understanding that the last two sentences of the Director's Report be omitted. All Commissioners voted yes.

#### REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR

Director Lacey stated she attended a public hearing for an education case. The first Pushout session was also had at a park. It was decided it wasn't dark enough to show the film at an earlier time, so the next session would be at 8:30 p.m. when it takes place at Veteran's Memorial Park in Bettendorf. Director Lacey coordinated and planned CLE on ACE's, the impact they have on the legal processes and how they impact access to justice. Director Lacey stated she continues to monitor COVID-19 rates and its impact on office functions. Director Lacey suggested we continue doing what we're doing now. Director Lacey stated that staff worked on upcoming outreach collaborations relating to equity and bias in government decision making. Director Lacey stated she was asked to give a presentation on this topic. Commissioner Swanberg asked Director Lacey about line 16 which stated the Director worked on litigation. Commissioner Swanberg asked about the FOIA issues, and the public hearing. Director Lacey stated the FOIA activity could actually belong under ongoing old business relating to harassment of Commission staff.

#### **Director's Report Old Business**

Director Lacey stated she met with Commissioner Swanberg and Commissioner Boyd to discuss issues between her and the Commission Chair. Director Lacey also stated she met with

Commissioner Guster and Commissioner Transou over the harassment issues with City staff. Director Lacey updated the Commission stating she filed a IPIB complaint against Mallory Hoyt for Hoyt's failure to produce the documents requested in Lacey's June 1, 2021 letter. Director Lacey stated that in the response to the IPIB complaint, the City Attorney Brian Heyer acknowledged that they were aware that the letter she sent to Mallory Hoyt was not a response to Hoyt's information request.

#### **Director's Report New Business**

Director Lacey stated she discovered the legal department and Mike Meloy made a settlement to pay most of Mike Meloy's bill. Director Lacey stated they planned on using the Commission's funds to pay for it, and that the Commission was not consulted on this agreement by the City.

A motion was made by Commissioner Swanberg, seconded by Commissioner Boyd, to accept the Director's Report for June. All Commissioners voted yes.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### A. In Person Meetings

The Commissioners had a lengthy discussion about whether to continue online meetings or go back to in person meetings. The Commission discussed the current state of COVID-19, the local and statewide vaccination rates, and mask recommendations from the CDC. Discussion included whether all meetings should be under the same guidelines or some with three Commissioners or less possibly being under other guidelines. Commissioner Pokora made a motion to have next month's regular meeting online on Zoom, it was seconded by Commissioner Guster. All Commissioners voted in favor. There was a consensus among all Commissioners to go month to month, voting based on what the majority felt about the current state of the virus, as to whether the Commission would have the next meeting online or in person for the following month.

#### B. Director Salary - Step Increase

Commissioners discussed approving a pay increase for Director Lacey. It was learned from Director Lacey that this is a yearly increase across the entirety of Davenport City employees. Commissioner Guster also stated this was a regular yearly pay increase across all Clty employees. During the discussion, Commissioner Pokora stated he did not know enough about this increase to approve it. There was more discussion on the issue, Commissioner Guster made a motion to approve Director Lacey's pay increase, Commissioner Boyd seconded it. There was more discussion, then Commission Secretary Transou stated there was a motion and a second so let's have a vote. A vote was then taken with all Commissioners voting to approve the pay increase, except Commissioner Pokora voting no, and Commissioner Batimana voting to abstain. On a 5-2 vote, the pay increase for Director Lacey was approved.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### A. Policing Reforms Proposal Followup

Commissioners discussed this issue. There was discussion by Commissioner Karp on whether someone from the public should be able to report an issue or concern to the Commission. Commissioner Boyd and Commissioner Guster made comments as well as to what would be better for the public. Commissioner Guster made a motion to table the reforms followup until next month's meeting. It was seconded by Commissioner Swanberg. All Commissioners voted yes.

#### B. Commissioner Communication and Harassment

Commissioner Guster stated he had a conversation with the City Administrator, and was told he needed to send a formal email to them. Commissioner Guster stated he would be sending that email out today.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT

Dan Audi Athena Gilbraith

Commissioner Boyd stated at this time that she would be attending the ADA Conference in Phoenix, AZ. Commissioner Boyd stated if it could be added to the agenda, she would give a report on the conference upon returning at the August meeting.

#### **ADJOURN**

At 1:27 p.m. a motion was made by Commissioner Guster, seconded by Commissioner Transou, to adjourn the meeting. All Commissioners voted yes.

The next meeting of the Commission will be August 10, 2021, at 12:00 p.m.
