Notable updates from Staff

Park Operations

- The first seasonal staff training took place on Monday, March 14. Those seasonal staff will begin working on Monday, March 21 cleaning parks and picking up limbs. Mowing will begin before we know it.
- We have a good group of returning staff and have a few more new hires lined up. We are still looking for staff, so please send interested people our way.
- CIP projects continue to progress. We have a lot going on playgrounds, roofs, park restrooms, recreation trail reconstruction, parking lot reconstruction, VV stone bridge, and Whalen walking path to name a few. It's great, but busy!!

Recreation

- Staff took 40 athletes to Iowa City on Saturday, March 12 for the Special Olympics Mid-Winter Games.
- Twelve athletes qualified in Muscatine for the Special Olympics state swimming competition which takes place in Ames, IA during the summer games.
- The Special Olympic track program kicked off this week, with 65 athletes registered. The competition will be held April 9 in North Scott to see who moves on to State in May.
- A new AmeriCorps member started at Roosevelt Community Center with a focus on getting the computer lab running and securing volunteers for the food pantry.
- Another AmeriCorps Member started within the department administration, Dean Halverson. Dean is focused on setting up a volunteer tracking system for the department.
- The Performing Arts Spring Break Camp (March 14-18) registration is full with 48 participants.
- Junior Theatre hosted 1,100 kindergartners from all the Davenport Community Schools as part of the 90-minute workshop series.
- Davenport Junior Theatre's Mainstage Production of Annie Jr was the highest attended show in DJT history with over 1,900 attendees.
- Youth basketball and youth indoor soccer winter seasons closed the weekend of March 12. Both seasons went well with very few issues.
- March 13-19 is National AmeriCorps Week. At the Wednesday, March 16 Council meeting Riley Vaughan, Program Manager, received a proclamation from Mayor Matson

highlighting the positive impact the AmeriCorps program has on the Davenport community.

- The Daddy Daughter Dance, held Sunday, February 20, saw over 200 happy faces.
- Staff are busy planning and preparing for spring and summer programs in addition to hiring.

Revenue Facilities

- Golf is currently receiving and processing new staff candidates to supplement returning seasonal staff.
 - If weather continues to improve, golf staff may begin the week of March 21.
- Golf Pro Shops are fielding multiple calls daily inquiring about open for the season.
- The River's Edge is winding down a successful winter programming season which comes to an end late March/early April.

Top Staff Challenges

Park Operations

• Ongoing recruitment concerns, but department staff are working together to offer multiple opportunities for potential candidates to participate in open interviews and communication about our hiring has spread via print materials, banners, media outlets and on social media.

Recreation

- The wind storm on Saturday, March 6, caused damage to 10 soccer goals at the Davenport Soccer Complex. This damage resulted in postponing the start date for Spring Youth Soccer from April 9 to April 23. Also, securing volunteer coaches for youth soccer teams has been more of a challenge than normal.
- The Davenport Junior Theatre nonprofit partner, Junior Theatre, Inc. cancelled the next Mainstage Production, *The Phantom Tollbooth*, to focus on rebuilding the organization and development of post-COVID processes and procedures.
- Always one of the biggest challenges continues to be recruitment and hiring. Staff continue to go to the schools, hold job fairs and open interviews, all in an effort to fill all of our positions.

Revenue Facilities

- New employees are coming in slower than previous years, but good candidates.
- Turf conditions are often too soft, squishy and/or frozen dependent on variations between nice, warmer weather and freezing days for courses to open early.

Communication Updates

• Returning in 2022, the Summer Youth Scholarship Program for Davenport youth in grades K-12 will support participation in summer time programming. The scholarship program, funded through the CARES Act to address COVID-19 related needs in Davenport, provides scholarships for Davenport residents to attend eligible summer

programs that will help them regain educational, social, emotional, and developmental opportunities lost throughout the COVID pandemic. The program began accepting applications on Monday, March 7.

- The Summer Kids Pass will go on sale Monday, March 21. The pass is good Memorial Day through Labor Day for \$50 per child. Participating agencies include: Davenport Parks and Recreation, Figge Art Museum, Putnam Museum, Citibus, Scott County YMCAs and the Quad Cities River Bandits.
