<u>Operating Budget</u> - This funds the department's daily operations and services like employee expenses, supplies and services, capital outlay, and allocated expenses.

Operating Summary:

- The Parks and Recreation Department uses funds from a variety of sources to maintain over 3,600 acres of park land and provide passive and active recreational opportunities for the community. Approximately 62% of the budget comes from the *General Fund* and *Trust and Agency Fund*.
- Approximately 23% of the department's budget accounts for the operation of the city's three public golf courses as an enterprise fund. The FY 2023 budget grew by 4.75% primarily due to the increase in employee expenses.

Notable updates from Staff

Park Operations

- Our horticultural staff planted 25,000 bulbs for spring between
 VanderVeer Park, Duck Creek Park, and the riverfront park locations.
- Over 20,000 linear feet of lights have been put up along the promenade at VanderVeer Park.
- The conservatory has been staged for its fall display with over 600 mum standards.
- Earlier in the year, a new playground was placed at Lafayette Park. The playground that was at Lafayette has been re-installed at the soccer complex.
- Operations crews have finalized their mowing routes for the season, wrapping up with mulching leaves.
- Nearly 1,100 yards of clay soil has been delivered to Credit Island in preparation of raising the grade to accommodate the new nature playground. This is the equivalent of 150 dump trucks.

Recreation

- Environmental Education held a Scouts Soil and Water Merit Badge Clinic with the assistance of an Army Corps of Engineers representative. They also held a Halloween Hike that had 15 people attend despite the 40-degree weather.
- We had an exceptional session of Learn-to-Skate receiving wonderful compliments from parents. Many of which are new and excited to sign up for the winter session beginning in January.
- We had to cancel the outdoor scary movie due to inclement weather.
- Junior Theatre held their 12th annual Halloween Bash, 30 student volunteers helped to pout on the event for 350 families. Event activities

- included a maze, carnival games, dance party room, crafts, cake walk, haunted house, spooky stories, costume contest and more!
- Junior Theatre has began hosting Eugene Fields elementary through their LEAD program. Every other Friday students attend a theater workshop that builds over the course of four visits, currently hosting 4-6th grades, in the winter spring they will host K-1, and 2-3.
- We successfully wrapped up fall sports programming including adult and youth soccer and softball.
- Courage League Basketball began Nov 2nd. We have 5 children with disabilities learning to play basketball. This is a great program that can be offered because of our Adaptive and Inclusive AmeriCorps Member.

Revenue Facilities

- Golf Courses are enjoying a fantastic fall season with steady weather extending play and revenues.
- Golf Courses have all blown out (winterized) irrigation systems, and are blowing and mulching as many leaves as we can before snow.
- Red Hawk Closed for the season November 5th with overalls revenues exceeding last year.
- Emeis and Duck Creek will remain open for play thru November with good temperatures in the forecast.
- Rivers Edge continues to move forward toward the completion of second ice rink. A few system problems have been discovered and resolved by staff and mechanical contractor. Expect Ice making in midlate November.
- Rivers Edge has acquired a second Olympia Ice-Resurfacer for the upcoming two-rink operation.
- Rivers Edge has been able to hire most of the staff vacancies for the winter season and also training a few golf staff to supplement the winter operations.
